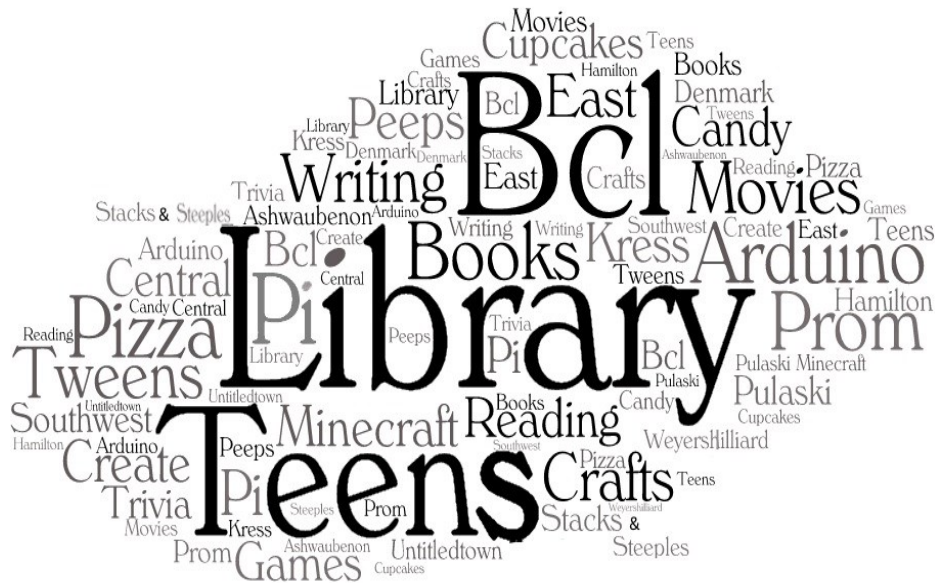

Arduino is a credit card-sized, programmable microcontroller that can read sensors, turn on lights, run motors, and more, based on the code you write. Hands-on library classes help you learn the basics and then expand your knowledge. The possibilities are endless!
