of wish-granting, talking eggs. Jerry Pinkney’s detailed illustrations capture the splendor of the enchanted farm; especially stunning are the spreads depicting technicolored chickens and dancing hares dressed in formal garb. (Ages 5-10)

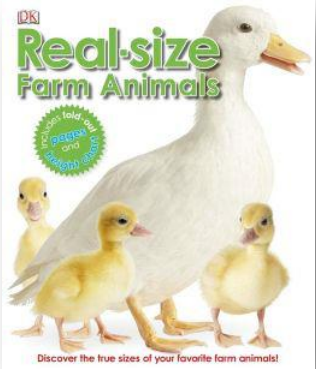

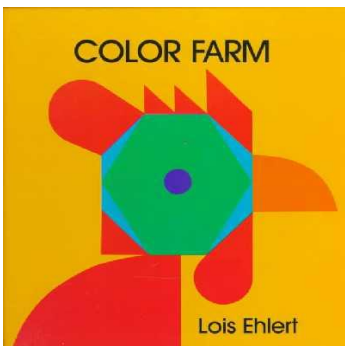
