An Early Learning Challenge for ages 0-6 and their adults

How to Participate:

- Starting today, write down each book title you read with your child on a 1000 Books Reading Record.
- When you complete the 50 titles on a reading record, you can fill out a 1000 Books Entry Form, and bring the Form and Reading Record to any Brown County Library.
- Each Entry Form becomes a chance to win a prize!
- Then get another Reading Record (ask at library or print from website).
- Read and record 50 more books.
- Continue until you reach 1000 books!
 - If you read to more than one child at once, the book can be included on each child's Reading Record.
 - If you read the same book to the same child more than once, you can write it down each time.
 - Include books read to your child by anyone – older siblings, grandparents, childcare providers, storytime librarians...

Why 1000 Books?

Yes, it's a lot! The goal is to encourage adults to read as many books as possible with young children before they enter school. Reading and talking about books - starting at birth is the best way to get little ones ready to read and learn on their own. Plus, it's fun!

Some ways to reach 1000 books: 1 book a day for 3 years or 3 books a day for 1 year
