Pre-Literacy Tips

Talking:

Talk with your children about the signs and logos you see on your daily commute or while running errands. This helps build print awareness.

Singing:

Clapping or tapping your feet to the beat of a song helps build their rhythm, which in turn can help them to hear how many syllables are in the song's words.

Reading:

While reading together, build your child's vocabulary by drawing attention to words they may be unfamiliar with and providing definitions.

Writing:

Talk with your child as they draw and help create captions for their art. This will help connect the spoken word with printed language.

Playing:

Make time for unstructured supervised play, providing everyday objects like tissue boxes, toilet paper tubes or blocks. This free-form play will spark your child's creativity.












BORN TO READ

April 23-29



Taking place annually during National Library Week, Born to Read distributes early literacy kits to parents with babies born at area hospitals.

The kits contain: two books, information on services and resources for parents, grandparents, and caregivers, library information including the 1000 Books Before Kindergarten program, library card applications, and more.

Launched in 1996, Born to Read encourages new parents to read to their babies to give them a head start on language development and other basic skills. Pediatric research indicates that early positive exposure to children's books, especially through reading aloud, helps children learn to read. Children's experiences being read to are the single most important predictors of later reading success.

Designed for the community, this library will be an exciting environment in which people can connect to a diverse platform of information, opportunities, and services. The Brown County Library is committed to providing free access to curated resources and services; designing and delivering early learning and literacy programs for children and families; and investing in technology to bridge digital and opportunity gaps.

The new library will contain inviting and comfortable adult reading areas, a young adult area, a children's area, meeting and study rooms, and a calming room. The marketplace will feature a fireplace and a coffee nook. High-speed WiFi, checkout stations, computers, and a business center are just a few conveniences that will be offered.

Exterior amenities include a drive-up window, an outdoor garden/green space, and ample parking for library patrons. The outdoor commons area will showcase native plantings, a play space designed for children, a pathway, and a variety of seating.

The new East Branch will be opening its doors and drive-up window this fall!
