

### **Pre-Literacy Tips**

#### Talking:

Take a short walk together and talk about buildings, cars, trees, and animals you see along the way.

#### Singing:

Find objects that make noise: keys, pots, lids, wooden spoons, etc. Sing along to your new instruments. Playing the instruments will help with gross motor development and singing will support listening and language skills.

#### Reading:

Find a book that focuses on the different sounds animals make. Seeing the sound in print will help your child associate the letters with the noises they make.

#### Writing:

Label your child's things with their name and let them label some of their items as well. This helps develop print awareness.

#### **Playing:**

Play zoo. Roar like lions, bark like seals, and make other animal sounds. Learning animal sounds supports the pronunciation of other words in your child's growing vocabulary.






